From the Head Road Captain Brent Tanguay

Finally, warmer weather is here and it's time to ride! I am very excited to be the Head Road Captain this year and look forward to a great season of riding and having fun with Mid-Maine Hog. Every HOG chapter exists to encourage and support group riding. Yes, we all work with our dealership on special projects and support L-A's charities as well as our own. But group rides are what we all joined for in the first place. So please join us for as many rides as you can. The more people ... the more fun. We have some great rides planned for this year, interesting places, good food, and always... Ice Cream!

All of our rides are listed on the Calendar section of the website www.mmlhog.org, but if you have a favorite ride that you would like to share, please let us know.

Remember, Ride and have fun.....then ride some more!

Here are a few things you need to know before you show up for a ride.

- Most of our rides start at L-A Harley-Davidson.
- Arrive prepared: full gas tank, empty bladder, proper gear and a good attitude.
- ➤ The posted run times are the DEPARTURE times! Please get there at least 15-30 minutes before the departure time.
- All current chapter members sign the sign-in sheet. As a member you are allowed one guest, who MUST sign an Adult Waiver form prior to going on the ride.
- Non-chapter members need to sign the sign-in sheet and note that they are a guest. All non-chapter members are required to sign an Adult waiver release <u>form</u>. Minors have two special releases: one <u>form</u> to be signed by a parent or guardian and the second (for minors between the ages of 12 and 18) a <u>Minor's Assumption of Risk</u> to be signed by the minor involved. Forms can be downloaded from our website or Ride Captains will have them.
- All rides are led by a Lead Road Captain (LRC) assisted by other qualified Road Captains the Road Captain riding at the back of the pack is called the Sweep Road Captain and there are normally Middle Road Captains also. They will serve as Lead Road Captain should the riders become separated. Normally the Lead Road Captain and the Sweep Road Captain communicate via CB radio. The channel will be announced at the pre-ride for anyone wishing to join in.
- > The Lead Road Captain will give a pre-ride briefing which will include the route, gas and rest stops, a review of riding rules, an introduction of Road Captains for the ride, mention of any hazardous conditions discovered on the pre-ride and the destination plan.
- ➤ We ride in a double row, staggered formation the Lead Road Captain will ride in the left hand side of the lane and the next rider in the right hand side and so forth.
- ➤ Riders will maintain at least a 2 second distance from the rider directly in front of them and 1 second behind the rider to their right or left. The actual distance will increase as speed increases Note: if you can not see the face of the rider diagonally in front of you in their mirror, you are too close. You are in their blind spot.
- ➤ You "own" your entire lane if a rider needs to swerve to avoid an obstacle or use another line through a corner the lane must be clear. Do NOT slide up on the bike in front of you!
- ➤ Hand signals will be used as appropriate these will be demonstrated at the pre-ride briefing,
- Riders should try to maintain their starting position in the group for the entire ride. This will allow them to become comfortable with the riding style of those riders around them.
- No one will be expected to ride beyond his or her comfort level.
- Mid-Maine Lewiston H.O.G does not block lanes at stop signs and traffic lights. Do not run red lights or stop signs in an attempt to remain with the pack. If riders become separated the LRC will either slow down or stop and wait until everyone is together again.
- ➤ Ride your own ride: Do not blindly follow the rider in front of you. Remain aware you are responsible for your own safety! Remember the SEE technique Search Evaluate Execute
- All rides end at the destination. Every effort will be made to ensure that all riders know where they are and how to get back from a destination. However it's always a good idea to carry a map of the local areas in case you are separated on the return.
- ➤ If there is a problem or a breakdown, the Sweep Road Captain will stop with the disabled bike and all other riders will continue on with the Lead Road Captain to a safe location before stopping.
- ➤ Mid-Maine Lewiston rides are drug and alcohol free events.

TCLOCK

After the long winter without riding (or riding infrequently), it is easy to sometimes forget the basics. Make pre-ride inspections routine and automatic. It doesn't have to take more than a few minutes and should be done before every ride.

T-clock is an acronym used to remind motorcyclists of the pre-ride inspection essentials.

- **T** Tires, Wheels, and Brakes; check tread depth, wear, weathering, bulges, and embedded objects; check air pressure; check wheels for bent spokes or cast wheels for cracks; check rims for out of round, check bearings for free play in tires; and check brakes to determine that each brake alone keeps bike from rolling.
- **C** Controls; look at the levers and pedals for broken, bent or cracked parts; be sure mounts are tight; check cables for frays and kinks, check hoses for cuts, cracks, leaks, bulges, chafing, or deterioration, be sure hose routing doesn't interfere with steering, and check throttle to be sure it moves freely, snaps closed, and doesn't rev when handlebars are turned.
- L Lights and Electrics; check battery terminals for clean and tight connections; check headlamp for high and low beam operation and aim; check tail lamp for operation and activation with both front and rear brake application; check left and right, front and back, turn signals; check mirrors and adjust; and check wiring for pinched or frayed wires and be sure wiring doesn't interfere with steering.
- **O** Oil and Other Fluids; check fluid levels; and check for leaks.
- **C** Chassis; check frame for cracks; check assessor mounts; check handlebar movement for full travel; check front forks for smooth travel, and check chain or belt for tension.
- **K** Kickstand; be sure the spring is working properly to pull it up and keep it up while riding; and check for cracks or bends.
