From the Head Road Captain Brent Tanguay

What a great summer for riding this has been! I hope you all have been enjoying it as much as Karen and I have. We have had some great chapter rides so far this year and more to come for the Fall. Keep checking our website calendar for upcoming rides and events.

This month I would like to share an experience I had while on the Dream Ride. I must say that this was the most organized and coordinated event that I have ever participated in and I will certainly do again. It was a very good tribute and example of group riding. We started from L-A Harley with a guided ride to Big Moose in Portland where we met up with more riders and had a pre-ride meeting with the event coordinators. This is a very large multi-state guided ride ending up in Farmington, CT, on the same day. The event sponsors supplied the ride leaders with GPS tracking cell phones so they knew where we were at all times. We also had a chase car following the group. The head road captain clearly explained the route, gas and rest stops. He also went over the importance of staggered riding especially with a group this size. As I said, a very well organized and planned event .The only part that I think our chapter does better, is communicating between the head road captain and the sweep with CB radios. Those of us who had CB's on this ride used them to communicate important information to keep us all together. For instance, our sweep could relay when everyone made it through an intersection or if some were still waiting at a light. Our head road captain on this ride did not have a CB so he really did not know where the tail of the group was. From my point of view when I lead a group ride it is a safe and comforting feeling to know where the tail of the group is. If we are not all together, do I slow down, safely pull over and wait, or keep going and hope they catch up?

Anyway, back to my experience. Karen was my passenger that day. We were on route 495 in Massachusetts in the middle lane in very heavy traffic traveling approximately 65 mph when I experienced my first **flat rear tire!** I felt the rear all of a sudden go down so I yelled into the CB that I had a flat. I heard Jerry on the CB say not to use the rear brake, which was great advice because when I did touch the rear brake, (a natural reaction) it made the bike weave from side to side. There was a car on our immediate right that I had to wait until he cleared so I could move over to the shoulder and stop. While slowing down the bike was very hard to control. Karen was great throughout the whole ordeal by remaining still and calm and letting me control the bike to a stop. The bikes behind us could all see what was happening and slowed and pulled over to stop with us. Scott called the nearest dealership and made arrangements for service when we arrived. The chase car stopped to check on us and we all agreed that our Mid-Maine group and the sweep, Officer Bud Caouette, would stay together and the rest would continue on with the chase car being the sweep. Soon a flat bed came and picked up the bike and delivered us to High Octane Harley Davidson. They changed the tire and soon we were on our way again. All the while we were in phone and text communication with the event coordinator as to our new arrival time and where the rest of the group was. It was nice to know that they cared to stay in touch and make sure we made it to the event.

The whole experience would have been much different if we were traveling alone, I truly do appreciate how fellow bikers are eager to help in a time of crisis. Thank you all!
