Responsibilities:

- Works with the sponsoring dealer to uphold the "Annual Charter for H.O.G. Chapters" and H.O.G. operating policies
- Assumes overall responsibility for the administration of the H.O.G. chapter and implementation of Harley Owners Group policies
- Signs annual H.O.G. Chapter Charter Application and ensures it is received in H.O.G. office by January 31
- If chapter is incorporated, ensures chapter complies with all corporate state annual filing requirements
- Promotes H.O.G. and the H.O.G. chapter to potential members
- Conducts chapter meetings
- Coordinates chapter officer responsibilities
- Ensures that risk management requirements set forth by the Chapter Insurance program, including procurement of necessary release forms, are met for all chapter activities
- Verifies that chapter T-shirt and merchandise guidelines are followed
- Ensures that all trademark requirements are met
- Ensures that chapter merchandise orders are supplied to the sponsoring dealer
- Ensures Chapter Officer News® is available to all fellow officers
- Routes H.O.G. correspondence to fellow officers and to membership, as requested



Assistant Director

Responsibilities:

- Assists the sponsoring dealer and chapter director in upholding the "Annual Charter for H.O.G. Chapters"
- Assists the director as requested
- Promotes H.O.G. and the H.O.G. chapter to potential members
- Informs chapter members of H.O.G. programs and benefits. The following officers should assist you in this function:
 - LOH® Officer - Ladies of Harley program and LOH Motorcycling Memories contest
 - Safety Officer - Motorcycle safety programs and Safe Rider Skills program
 - Photographer - Staff Photographer pin
- Conducts new member orientation
- Acts as the liaison between the chapter and the State Rally Committee



Treasurer

Responsibilities:

- Assists the sponsoring dealer and chapter director in upholding the "Annual Charter for H.O.G. Chapters"
 - Collects chapter dues (no more than \$24 per member per year)
 - Manages all chapter funds
 - Oversees the preparation of chapter federal, state and local tax returns
 - Reports financial transactions to members monthly
 - Ensures that any charitable contributions are managed according to H.O.G. guidelines
 - Maintains a running comparison of current year chapter finances with prior year chapter finances for presentation at Annual Meeting

Secretary

Responsibilities:

- Assists the sponsoring dealer and chapter director in upholding the "Annual Charter for H.O.G. Chapters"
- Oversees the administrative needs of the chapter
 - Keeps minutes of all chapter meetings, including "Annual Chapter Business Meeting"
 - Ensures that all insurance requirements are met
- Oversees membership officer position to:
 - Ensure that chapter members have current national H.O.G. memberships
 - Enroll new chapter members
 - Administers annual chapter member renewal process
 - Ensure that the most current officer and chapter address information is on file with H.O.G.
 - Maintain annual Chapter Membership Enrollment Form and Release on file for each member
- Submits the following forms/reports to H.O.G.:
 - H.O.G. Chapter Charter Application (once a year, by January 31)
 - Other reports and forms as requested
- Obtains, files and maintains records of all insurance forms, including release and injury report forms
- Administers the annual chapter business meeting
- If chapter is incorporated, submits corporate state annual report to proper state office (or chapter attorney)



It's always a good time to take a Harley Holiday

You don't have to spend a lot of money to have a lot of fun on a Harley.
How to take a Harley vacation on about \$30/day: I figure I spent \$15 in gas daily and about the same for meals during a series of day trips in Maine and beyond. And we certainly continued my tradition, "live to ride, ride to eat," having hearty meals along the way.

Fall is a great time to take a vacation on a motorcycle, as long as Mother Nature chooses to cooperate. The week of Sept. 23-30 largely was great riding weather, although frequently requiring layers, and my chaps. The great thing is during the week day riding, there was very little traffic and we felt like we had the road to ourselves much of the time.

This week's Harley log included:

Saturday - Hanging out at L-A Harley Davidson, selling few raffle tickets on a dreary day...



Sunday - Got a late start with fellow HOG member Art Hurley (of Rangeley) and rode over to Madison for a late lunch at the House of Pizza. Art, who has put more than 140,000 miles on his Street Glide just since 2008 (!), knows all the back roads. While passing through Industry (Route 43), we saw a nice bald eagle sailing above. All but one day, the most common wildlife sighting was turkey (mostly in flocks - as well as a few behind the wheel of a car ☺). A great blue heron and sea gulls rounded out the mix.

Monday - A ride on back roads with Art to Augusta and lunch at Olive Garden, then out to Belfast and down Route 1, with a stop in Warren to see Maine motorcycle legend Jack Sharkey (American Iron), an old-school Harley mechanic; and then home, while skirting an ominous black cloud for a big part of the day. We only encountered a total of 10 minutes of light rain, followed by a brilliant full rainbow in the Augusta area. It's definitely not the destination - it's the ride.

Tuesday - Met Art in Rangeley and then we rode across to Colebrook, N.H., with lunch at Howard's, a stop at Beaver Brook Falls, then back roads until crossing the border in Canaan, Vt. (a helmet state) and following the Connecticut River on the Vermont side for a time before crossing back at Lancaster, N.H. and navigating home on back roads. The most brilliant foliage of the week was seen on Route 16 out of Rangeley this day, while Vermont was greener. New England is great - giving one the ability to experience three states in a day!

Wednesday - A rainy day kept me from the road for the most part, but I still managed to go have a rear tire replaced and run other errands to maintain my general Harley theme.

Thursday - Fellow H.O.G. rider Walter joined Art and me at L-A Harley and led us to Boothbay Harbor, where we dined on heaping bowls of fish chowder at the Ebb Tide Restaurant (food continuing to be a big part of the adventure). Interesting sights included an oceanside drive and one of the "Pirates of the Caribbean" ships sitting in dry dock.



Friday - While even cooler, layers worked well and Art and I rode up to Bangor, having lunch at the Epic Buffet at the Hollywood Slots Casino. It was Route 2 on the way up and then more back roads with a stop at Central Maine Harley in Hermon (does not remotely compare to L-A Harley). The ride returned through Harland on the way back. My luck ran out in regard to the weather, as the last 10 minutes of my ride home was in rain, although it didn't start coming down really hard until after I had arrived home. Art, unfortunately, had about 20 minutes of rain, racing ahead of the storm back to Rangeley.

Saturday - I hung out at L-A Harley for a time and then drove (by car) on this rainy day to the Saracen's clubhouse in Turner for the Ride for Arielle Pelletier, a victim of a brain injury. There, another buffet, of course, and the music of Ruckus, with a silent auction and drawings part of the benefit festivities. And lots of interesting characters...



Sunday - The last day of my vacation was a bit of a letdown, with heavy rain in the Wilton-Farmington area, so it winded up being my only day without a motorcycle connection, other than me taking the time to write this article.

Overall, I logged 1,044 miles on my trusty 2002 Heritage Softail over a seven-day period and saw quite a bit of Maine, a portion of New Hampshire and a little bit of Vermont. You can't ask for more than that, and I would consider another fall riding vacation in the future. Keep the rubber on the road.
