
Minutes by Donald Gabriel / Secretary

Riding in the rain!!!

We have had some very nice group rides so far this year and for the good weather. Although we don't really like to think about it, we should always be prepared for the "R" word. It may not be raining when you head out, but there is always a chance that you will encounter a rain shower on your journey. Having good rain gear makes it a little more bearable or for somequite enjoyable. Your rain gear should include a rain jacket and pants that fit easily over your clothes and shoes, boot covers, water proof gloves and a helmet with a face shield (don't forget to apply anti-fog to the face shield). Along with the proper gear, there are a few other things to consider, number one is to slow down! Use extreme caution when starting, cornering and stopping. Avoid riding on the painted lines on the road or the center of the lane as these areas are very slippery when wet. If it is raining so hard that it affects your vision, pull over and wait for it to stop. All in all, as long as you are prepared and cautious, riding in the rain is not so bad. So, the next time you have a plan to ride and the forecast calls for showers, or it is raining when you leave, but clearing later, be prepared, and just put on your *Big Boy (or Girl) Pants* and go riding!!
