

Hello everyone,

Spring is finally here, really, it says so on the calendar. I know it sure doesn't feel like spring but the days are getting longer and the thermometer is consistently on the north side of zero, so that's encouraging. It won't be long now before we get our Harleys all dusted off and ready to ride. There is one very important order of business that needs to be taken care of before you hop on for that first ride of the season,

Registration and inspection...

This is a reminder that all motorcycle registrations will expire on March 31. This is a result of a new Maine law, effective 03/01/2012, stating that all motorcycle registrations, issued on or after March 1, 2012, will expire on March 31st of the following year. Also under the new law, Maine Inspection Stations are required to issue a certificate of inspection and an official inspection sticker for each motorcycle.

- The inspection sticker must be attached to the upper left corner of the motorcycle registration plate.
- The inspection certificate must be kept with the motorcycle registration certificate.
- When a registration plate is re-assigned to another motorcycle, the certificate of inspection and the inspection sticker expire and the other motorcycle must be inspected to receive a new certificate and sticker.
- The motorcycle registration stickers will include the month and year of expiration and must be placed in the upper right corner of the plate.



Make sure that your bike is properly registered, inspected and insured and keep all corresponding paperwork on the bike at all times.

Also, our next HOG Chapter meeting is Saturday April 4th and is our annual ride planning meeting. If you are tired of going to the same places now is the time to suggest something new. Rides can be long or short, straight or curvy, flat or hilly, with a lunch stop or perhaps a byo picnic lunch, but most important of all is the ice cream stop at the end of the ride!

Part II: Father/Daughter Road Trip to Cape Breton Island Nova Scotia summer of 2014:



So now a year later I find myself on a road trip with my daughter sitting in a restaurant in Moncton New Brunswick. Angela had heard the story of the previous year's trip before but we were having a new laugh about it. After we finished I asked our waitress where I would find the nearest fire station so I could get my wife a Moncton Fire Department tee shirt. The waitress told me the closest one is on the way back to our hotel. So we hopped back on my Harley and as we were riding back we spotted a Gelato or frozen yogurt place. After turning in we pulled up next to two other bikes, one a Harley the other a Yamaha. The couple that owned the bikes were enjoying their treat with their young son, when as often happens with bikes, we

started conversing. I was admiring his touring model Harley as I've been thinking about getting one sometime. Well one thing led to another and we told him about our road trip and the Moncton Fireman story from the previous trip. We busted up laughing when he told us that he is a fireman! This was too funny. We exchanged phone numbers. He told me to call him in the morning and he will get me a tee shirt!

My daughter and I had such a laugh. It turns out when I called him in the morning he asked me to stay at the hotel for another twenty minutes and he would come over with the shirt! Like I said, the Canadians I have come in contact with are warm, accommodating people. He brought the shirt and even signed it for us. We took some photos and he even asked to have his dog in one of the pictures. I have met some wonderful people on my motorcycle road trips!

After parting with our new friend we headed for Cape Breton Island. We traveled east on RT 2 and crossed the provincial line into Nova Scotia. We then decided to ride part of the way off the highway and so we took a secondary road, RT 6 which meanders along the Northumberland Strait and eventually turns into the Gulf of St. Lawrence. We were in awe of the beauty surrounding us. We passed farms and small towns as we enjoyed the rolling hills overlooking the open spans' of water. I have often read of other riders' accounts of the purr of the engine and wonderful peaceful feeling that is so unique to riding a Harley. I have experienced it many times in the past but this was extra special as we rode along together, my daughter and me ... I could feel the shared serenity.

Off of RT 6 we then rode on RT 104, the Trans-Canada Highway. I have never been a fan of highway riding. It isn't particularly as enjoyable as a country road to me. With that said I admit I do enjoy riding the Canadian highways in comparison to the north eastern states such as RT I-95. The Canadian Highways are not nearly as congested, at least not those I have experienced riding, in New Brunswick and Nova Scotia. They have many areas of wide open spaces.

We crossed the causeway and bridge onto Cape Breton.

We settled in for the night at the Silver Dart Lodge at the center of Cape Breton Island, a mile or so from the center of the town of Baddeck. The lodge sits high on a hill overlooking the upper portion of a lake named "Bras D'Or Lake" the lodge was a perfect place to start and stop after riding around the famous Cabot Trail, which was on our morning agenda. For now, after checking in at the lodge, Angela and I rode into town and reserved seats for a "Ce'ilidh" or Ka-Lee (which is Gaelic for "a gathering of friends"). After a relaxing meal with outdoor seating facing the main street downtown we went to the Ce'ilidh".

You will find wonderful fiddle music and dancing there. Cape Breton Island is well known for its fiddle music. It is rooted in Scottish and Irish heritage. While we were there a woman running the event asked for volunteers to come up and learn some traditional dances. She asked for four couples to come forward. At first, no one would get up. I prodded for Angela to try it with me. Being the spirited soul that she is, she got up. Others were apprehensive. While standing there waiting for others to come out of their shells I spotted a sign sitting on the window sill that tugged at my heart, it read.... "Dance like no one is watching". I held it up for all to see, waving it from side to side. It worked, and we got three other couples to join in the dance. The next morning after breakfast we started our journey on the Cabot Trail. The Cabot Trail encompasses the northern tip of the province of Cape Breton. We chose to ride it counter clockwise because that would put us riding with the Atlantic Ocean and Gulf of St. Lawrence on the edge of the road.


